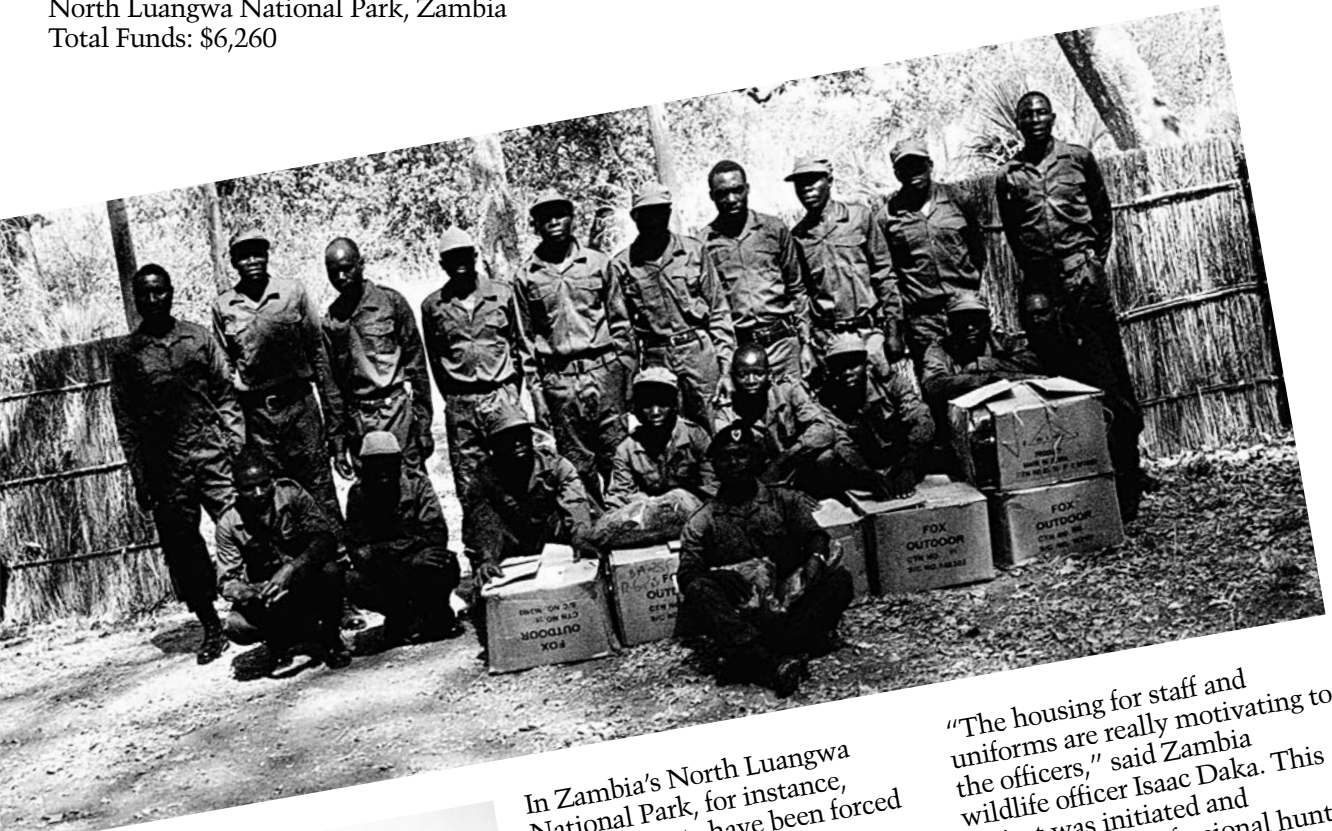


Making a Difference for Wildlife

In Zambia's North Luangwa National Park, for instance, wildlife scouts have been forced to work without appropriate uniforms, field boots, or facilities from which to launch their anti-poaching operations.

"The housing for staff and uniforms are really motivating to the officers," said Zambia wildlife officer Isaac Daka. This project was initiated and supervised by professional hunter P. J. Fouche.

IN THE IMPOVERISHED and often war-torn region of southern Africa, creating an appropriate infrastructure and logistics system for effective wildlife management and anti-poaching efforts can be very difficult at best. In the poorest regions, even basic equipment becomes a valued, and rare, commodity.

Thanks to funding from SCI's *Alamo San Antonio* and *Utah Chapters*, as well as other outdoor organizations and concerned individuals, 200 sets of uniforms and boots were distributed this year to scouts in North Luangwa's Musalangu, Lumimba, and Chizera game management areas. The funding also helped pay for the erection of four brick buildings in the Luelo Scout Camp, located in Musalangu, to act as housing for the scouts.
